This Psalm follows the dramatic three act structure that is at the heart of great story telling throughout the ages, a fact that perhaps explains why it has inspired so many musical settings. English composer Martin How sets it to a choir singing in unison, giving a nod to earlier styles of chant and clarity to the text. How served most of his career with the Royal School of Church Music where he developed and expanded programs for the motivation and training of young singers.
