Next Week in Adult Education May 12, David Roll, "Ascent to Power: FDR's Final Days and Truman's Transformation"

GPC member David Roll joins us for a discussion of his new book, Ascent to Power: The Story of Franklin Roosevelt's Final Days and Harry Truman's Extraordinary Transformation. Once Truman emerged from Roosevelt's shadow, he championed democracy and freedom abroad and at home, restored and protected postwar Europe via the Marshall Plan and NATO, and ushered in the modern civil rights movement. Though little has been written about Truman's faith and religious views, David will probe what little evidence exists. Will Quinn will moderate the discussion. Before a second career writing twentieth century history, David practiced antitrust law at the FTC and Steptoe & Samp; Johnson and he founded the Lex Mundi Pro Bono Foundation, a public interest organization that continues to provide pro bono legal services to social changemakers throughout the world.
